New Primary Maths Curriculum

The new Primary Maths Curriculum was distributed to schools recently. This current school year, schools will have to familiarise themselves with the curriculum and implementation will begin in September 2024. A suite of supports has been outlined by the Department of Education. Mr Connolly and Ms O'Connor attended a one-day seminar in Sligo Education Centre in October. There will be a school closure later in the year to allow all teachers to attend training; this date has not been given to our school yet. We will give parents/guardians as much notice as possible.

Languages Connect

We were successful in our application to be part of the Languages Connect Programme this year. After Christmas, 3rd & 4th class pupils will receive instruction in Irish Sign Language for one hour per week for 8 weeks. This is a wonderful way to not only learn a new language but also to develop a greater appreciation for diversity and to promote inclusion. Brigid O'Connor (a parent) is a qualified ISL tutor and will be teaching our pupils. This programme is fully funded by the DES.

Creative Schools

Creative Schools is a flagship of the Creative Youth plan – led by the Arts Council in partnership with the Departments of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sports and Media , Education & Skills and Children & Youth Affairs.

Creative Schools aims to give children the opportunity to experience creativity as an integral part of their education placing the arts and creativity at the centre of school life. Each school is supported by a Creative Associate who develops an individual school plan, and creates and strengthens links between the school and arts and cultural organisations. The long term aim is that every school will be able to fully embrace the arts and creativity, ensuring a positive experience and strong outcomes for children.

It is well recognised that engagement in the arts can nurture a child's sense of confidence and wellbeing. Creative activity also enables communication and collaboration, stimulates imaginations and harnesses curiosity; all necessary skills required for successful learning. The initiative recognises that schools play an important role in providing opportunities for children to participate in arts and culture and doing so, also develop socio-emotional wellbeing, cognitive development and positive attitudes towards school. We will engage with the Creative Schools initiative over the next four years. Our Creative Associate is Fiona McGeown. She has already lead an initial workshop with 3rd-6th classes and has helped us to establish our Arts Council. Our sincere thanks to Aideen Bruen for preparing the application on behalf of our school and to Jacky Burnside who will lead the Creative Schools Initiative in our school. We look forward to bringing you more news soon!

Swimming Lessons

3rd & 4th classes will begin a 6 week course of <u>swimming lessons</u> in January as part of the P.E. Curriculum. This year's theme was 'human' and there were projects created on the circulatory system, the respiratory system, the senses, muscular system, nervous system etc. The children learned so much about the human body as well as developing their oral language skills, presentation skills, the ability to answer questions posed to them by visitors to their exhibit etc. The whole school enjoyed the opportunity to look at the projects at our own Science Fair in the school hall. Many thanks to Mr Ownie Coyle, Ms Camilla Harvey and Ms Niamh Gallagher for facilitating our participation at this year's ATU Science Fair.

1st-6th classes were lucky to avail of the free <u>Heritage in Schools Workshops</u> as part of Science week back in October. 1st-3rd classes completed the Seatrails workshop learning about archaeology, the marine environment and costal heritage, while 4th-6th classes took part in a Junior Citizen Scientific Workshop with Martina Butler.
