Ethos

Catholic Schools Week was celebrated in our school from 21st-28th January. This year's theme was Catholic Schools as Communities of Service.

Maths Curriculum

The school was closed on Wednesday 24th January, so that teachers could attend training on the new Primary Maths Curriculum. This was a very informative session for teachers. For the remainder of this school year, we will be familiarising ourselves with the new curriculum and trying out new approaches and strategies. Stay Safe

The Stay Safe programme will be taught in all classes this term. The aim of the Stay Safe programme is to teach children personal safety skills so that they can look after themselves in situations which could be upsetting or dangerous. It deals with situations such as getting lost, disagreements between friends and bullying. It also teaches children the safety skills necessary to protect themselves from physical or sexual abuse and it emphasises the importance of telling a trusted adult about any problems or worries they have.

The Stay Safe programme is part of the Social, Personal and Health Education Curriculum which all primary schools are required to implement. It is important that parents/guardians are aware of the content of the Stay Safe lessons and are able to discuss the lessons with their children. Other exciting opportunities...

- All classes began a 5 week programme of workshops with <u>Bricks 4 Kidz</u> this week. Children are exploring the principles of science, technology, engineering and maths using Lego. In addition, the children are developing their fine motor skills, oral language skills, the ability to follow instructions, to work co-operatively, and much more. The instructors were very impressed with the creativity they saw and the perseverance that was demonstrated when the tasks became more challenging. We look forward to another workshop next week. Thank you to the Parents Association for subsidising the cost of these workshops.
- We were successful in our application to be part of the <u>Say Yes to Languages</u> programme this year. Today, 3rd & 4th class pupils received their first lesson in Irish Sign Language from Brigid O'Connor, a parent of children in our school. This programme is fully funded by the DES.
- 3rd & 4th classes began <u>swimming lessons</u> earlier this week as part of the PE Curriculum. The first lesson went very well. Our thanks to the Parents Association again for covering the cost of the swimming lessons and to the parents for funding the bus.
- 5th class children are participating in an 8 week programme of <u>Drama Workshops</u> through the Blast Residency Programme. A drama teacher is visiting the school every Friday to work with the children. This is funded by the Department of Education.
- 6th class are participating in the Junior Entrepreneur Programme again this year. Ably guided by Mr Connolly, the children are busy brainstorming ideas for their business ventures. We look forward to seeing what they come up with.
