Curriculum / Extra Curricular

- Swimming Lessons (3rd & 4th), Irish Sign Language Classes (3rd & 4th) and Blast Drama Workshops (5th) are going very well. The children are thoroughly enjoying these experiences. Thank you for your support in running these programmes.
- 3rd & 4th classes enjoyed clay modelling with artist, Kathryn Maguire, recently as part of the <u>Creative Schools</u> Project. Fiona, our Creative Associate will be back in the school later this week to discuss what we will be doing in the next phase of the project.

- The <u>Stay Safe Programme</u> which forms part of the Social, Personal and Health Education Curriculum is being taught in all classes this term.
- 6th class children continue their <u>Junior Entrepreneur Projects</u>. Last Thursday, we welcomed some local business people to the school Michael Farrell (5 Star Fun), Lorna McGowan (Grange Pharmacy) and Martin Feeney (Atlantic Sheepdogs). In their groups/individually, the children presented their business ideas to the '*Dragons*'. They made use of sample products, brochures and video presentations to promote their businesses. It was wonderful to see how confident and proud of themselves they were after finishing and getting feedback from the Michael, Lorna and Martin. We are very grateful to the '*Dragons*' for giving of their time so freely last week.
- We celebrated <u>Friendship Week</u> last week. This forms part of our Anti-Bullying Policy and is an important week in the school calendar to highlight and promote kindness, respect, tolerance and friendship. All classes engaged in a variety of activities including art, music, story, discussion, random acts of kindness challenge etc. The week culminated in a whole school assembly in which we all sang the Bruno Mars' song 'Count on Me'.
